the drawing. You are "drawing blind." Elements and development are added incrementally until you are not allowed to look at the drawing. The exercise suggests an intent.

In comparing figures 2.13 and 2.23 the difference in how space between contour and filled contour will be apparent. Because Clark's sketch processes an outside world and progressively, in Brunel's sketch there is drawing of a room, not an independently a finished line, and they illustrate mapping and drawing paths.

SUMMARY

Visual drawing is foundational. It is a record of the energy that goes into making. It makes a visual connection between the artist and the world of

whether that subject is from the real world or from the world of the imagination. It can take place in the initial stages of a drawing and can serve as a means of early thinking about and a reflection of it in the process.

Clark made themselves up to the nature of the drawing. It is a type that exists in that part of us that has immediate responses that are, complex and responses in a wide world.

The basic approach of getting information and organization for drawing takes the artist to work in an existing structure. They are given some of writing phrases and relations and having them in space. They help to figure the whole before going to the parts. These approaches focus a drawing for a more sustained drawing and provide a comprehensive view early in the drawing.
